What are the entry requirements?

The entry requirements for the PhD are:

- ✓ Sufficient English language skills (e.g., IELTS 6.5 or above)
- ✓ Sufficient digital competences to work online in a Google environment
- ✓ Master's degree (MQF level 7 qualification) or
- ✓ Distinction profile of Bachelor degree (MQF level 6 qualification)

If you do not have the required number of 90 ECTS on the Masters level, it is possible to acquire them through our [Master Completion Pathway](#) within 6-18 months.

What will be my dissertation topic?

The final dissertation topic or thesis will be tailored to researching solutions for cutting-edge challenges in academic and scientific research to make an original contribution to the body of knowledge.

PhD students typically choose a dissertation topic about

- 1 Their organisation (e.g., business (SMEs, MNEs), government agency, NGOs),
- 2 A specific industry (e.g., IT, Health Care, Automotive, Tourism, Telecom, Banking)

- 3 A current issue (e.g., digitalisation, circular economy, metaverse, artificial intelligence, ethics),
- 4 Business or career opportunities (e.g., consulting, counselling / training, interim management),
- 5 Specific management and leadership skills (e.g., in finance, digital marketing), or
- 6 Their own personal interests.

What is the structure of the programme?

The PhD programme consists of 13 modules, which are studied in 12-13 quarters (= 1 module per term) or within at least three years.

The 13 modules are divided into the following four phases of study:

Launching. In the first phase of study, PhD students will identify their dissertation topic and be prepared to conduct doctoral level academic research.

Preparing. The second study phase includes the preparation of the dissertation proposal and all approvals to begin data collection.

Finalizing. In the third phase of study, PhD students will collect and analyze their data, present and discuss their results, and complete their dissertation.

Defending and Publishing. In the final phase of study, DBA students will defend and prepare the publication of their dissertations.

In all these phases, PhD students will be closely accompanied and supported by their dissertation advisors, will benefit from publication opportunities and present their papers at academic conferences.
